This information has been designed to give you some ideas of what you could include in your All about me profile.

The information and forms have been developed in consultation with Sutton parents/carers of children and young people with Special Educational Needs and Disabilities.

"All about me" is designed to help you tell others about your family and what is important to you. Please include photographs and pictures if you would like to.

We recognise that having to repeat information about your child many times, to a range of different professionals can be both time consuming and emotionally draining so have designed these guidance notes to give you some ideas of what you might include. Please ensure that it includes the views, interests and aspirations of the child or young person as it will be used to develop the EHC Plan.

Important People in my Life, My Circle of Support and All About Me Ideas: these are visual tools that you could use to help you map out the different kinds of support that your child/young person has around them.



<u>Personal Profile</u> – "All about me" (child's / young person's name) (Guidelines for keyworkers and parents)

Section (A) The views, interests and aspirations of the child / young person and their parents.

<u>Background Information</u> (Child's / young person's life story so far.....)

Include:

- Where and when the child / young person was born
- Developmental milestones
- Other significant family details
- How the child / young person's needs, diagnosis and medical needs impacts on their learning and every day skills (e.g. social communication, speech and language) if applicable
- Specialist services and support offered to date and pre-schools/schools attended

All About Me....

- Short positive introduction to child / young person
- Communicates by:

A summary of how to communicate with the child and engage them in decision making? Include as necessary verbal / non-verbal communication, e.g. eye-pointing, gestures, signing and speech. Use of objects of reference, Makaton, symbols, PECS etc.

Health & Medical needs:

For example, asthma, epilepsy, reflux, airway support, medication etc.

Vision / Hearing:

How it affects their hearing and sight.

Drinking / Eating:

Including allergies and any dietary and specialist needs (e.g. gastrostomy fed)

Physical needs and equipment needed:

Equipment: e.g. specialised chair, standing frame, splints, walker, hoist.

• Self-care and independence:

Including personal care if appropriate:

Other essential information you need to know about:

Including any sensory issues, behaviour and special interests

Child's / Young Person's Views and Aspirations

How has been involved in writing 'All About Me':

- If written in the first person, the plan should make clear whether the child or young person is being quoted directly or if the views of the parents or professionals are represented and the child's views are being communicated through parents / carers.
